Renewing Golders Green Town - Consultations

On Tuesday I attended a "Golders Green Town Centre Tea Party", in Golders Green Crescent, to discuss our experiences of the Town Centre, what we think of it and to explore ways we can play a part in regenerating the High Street, making it brighter, more inviting and accessible to those who use it. A questionnaire was filled in asking us to describe what we feel, what we use and ideas we might have to help make it better for the community. There was a picture exhibition showing some ideas and features that could be adopted, that other areas in London have successfully designed and put in place to make the environment more useful and appealing. World Homeless Day - 10th October



In his sermon, Kamran talked of World Homeless Day and the tragedy of the numbers of homeless across the world where there are millions of homeless caused through poverty, war, climate change and so many other reasons of real shame. Many of us contribute to a wide range of charities through donations and sending provisions to a wide number of organizations.

Just for his time, in the present climate, it is appropriate to focus on this country, where perhaps we can help in more immediate and practical ways, we have, to our shame, many thousands of homeless of all ages sleeping on our streets, destitute, often without families or have families who disown them, who are on drugs, have suffered much abuse and neglect as children, who have mental health problems and a number who having been discharged from the Forces simply having no-where to go. Because of the threat of financial issues people are experiencing it is predicted there will be more doing so. Anyone walking in central London in the evening cannot fail to see the numbers sleeping on the pavements, on bits of cardboard wrapped in flimsy blankets or in sleeping bags. Their average life expectancy is around 35 years. There are several organisations that do amazing work to care for them, providing food, washing and medical facilities and sometimes finding rooms.

St Martin-in-the-Fields, for example, runs an organization called "Connections", established in 1989. It works with homeless and disadvantaged people in central London. Over 5,000 homeless people are helped every year. The Specialist services include a Day and Night Centre, cooking and feeding those who come on a Sunday, providing Outreach for rough sleepers, skills training and career advice, activity programmes and specialist support for complex needs provided to 200 people every day. By encouraging each person to address the issues which caused their homelessness, Connections (www.connection-at-stmartins.org.uk) helps them to gain the skills and confidence to make lasting changes in their lives.

St Mungo's is another organisation that works to help those who are sleeping in the street. Every night members of their 17 outreach teams are out on the streets to help those rough sleeping move away into bed and support. They work to prevent homelessness too. Their contact number is: https://www.mungos.org You could try googling them for full information describing what they do.

There are many other organisations that work with homeless in each London Borough. It is important to mention our own **Homeless Action Barnet (HAB)** who provide so much good support for Barnet's most vulnerable people. In a standard week around 250 people will seek support from the experienced team at **HAB**. Their clients receive a welcome, food and a hot shower, along with support to help overcome their issues and ultimately assist them in finding accommodation and their own independence.

At Golders Green we support HAB with Together in Barnet (TIB) by providing sleeping accommodation and food during the winter months in partnership with Alyth Synagogue and other churches. Further details about this please contact **Nehar** who will give you information on how you can support this on-going initiative that will be starting early next year. We welcome more volunteers.

Food Bank Collection

Thinking of all the above, and the increasing numbers of families and individuals that are using food banks, **Nehar** suggested on Sunday that it would be helpful if we collected food and other goods to take to be taken to our nearest food banks. If you would kindly, as last time, bring them to church, leave them in the office or in church at the Sunday Service, they would be very welcome. If you want any provisions picked up, please ring the office (020 8455 1873). Many foodbanks have reported recently they are getting short of goods as people who often donate are finding their own finances diminishing. So, there is an even greater need. With many thanks.

Thought for The Day Radio 4 at 8.45am - Monday October 5th.

Last Monday, I switched on my radio just in time to hear TFTD by the Revd Dr Michael Banner, Dean, Fellow and Director of Studies in Theology and Religious Studies at Trinity College, Cambridge University. Listening to him I was riveted by his thoughts which focused on conservation in the context of "Life being Unfair" and the story of Zacchaeus, the less than wholly honest tax collector, who, moved by Jesus, promised to return his illgotten gains and to do justice. I contacted Dr Banner and asked if I could have his script for our newsletter. Not only did he send it, later on, he sent me another article he is writing for a magazine along the lines of "Equity and Justice". A man of obvious deep thought and concern for the world. Anyway, here it is for you to read just as he wrote and broadcasted it.

Thought for the Day: "Life is not Fair"

Revd Dr Michael Banner Dean Fellow, Director of Studies in Theology and religious studies at Trinity college Cambridge university.

"Good morning.

Generations of exasperated parents have relied on the pithy mantra 'life's <u>not</u> fair' to try to bring an end to what threaten to be interminable family disputes. Whether you call it gloomy pessimism, or healthy realism, children are told in effect - that's what life is like, you better get used to it.

Two different stories of unfairness caught my eye in the last 24 hours.

First of all, the new President of Kenya, writing ahead of the upcoming Cop27 meeting in Africa this November, has stressed the urgency of effective action on climate change - and he makes the point that 'Africa is the continent most affected by climate change, but least responsible for it.' In other words, the industrial revolution took place mostly in the developed north which took most of the benefits; the consequences, including droughts,

extreme temperatures, and crop failure, are distributed across the globe, with Africa getting much more than its fair share.

You may also have seen the report from Friends of the Earth, relying on Government data, which shows that people in the UK from minority ethnic backgrounds are at least three times more likely than others to live in neighbourhoods with very high air pollution, putting them at greater risk of heart attacks, cancer and strokes. To add insult to injury, the cause of some key pollutants is cars - and yet people in poorer areas as less likely to own and use cars than those living in more wealthy and less polluted districts.

The prophet Amos declares to the people of Israel 'let justice run down like water, and righteousness as a mighty stream.' And when Zacchaeus, the less than wholly honest tax collector, promises to return his ill-gotten gains - to do justice - Jesus proclaims, 'Today salvation has come to this house'. The distribution of the effects of climate change across the world and the distribution of the effects of pollution within the UK are not just unfair but reflect long standing unfairnesses. Africa had no proper share in development in the 19th and 20th century; and the people in the UK most affected by air pollution are typically deprived on other metrics too.

'Life's <u>not</u> fair' is meant to foreclose further discussion, especially when the clock is ticking down to school time. But the declarations of the prophets and of Jesus - and even of that insistent voice at the breakfast table saying, 'it's not fair' - rightly challenge us to look for and act for the sake of a different and fairer future."
