What a lovely Service we had on Sunday, celebrating and learning about **Christianity in India and St Thomas the Apostle** who founded it. That, while they were two different countries, they shared so much between them. While both he and Naila were from Pakistan and Nehar was from India they are all Punjabis. The emphasis, in our varied congregation, was on the fact we are all Christians and belong together, “Although we are many, we are all one Body”, we say every week in our Service. During the Service Naila sang psalm 23 in Urdu while Kamran accompanied her on the harmonium and Nehar said the Lord’s Prayer in Hindi.



After the Service we had our “**Bring and Share Lunch**”. Pictures below.



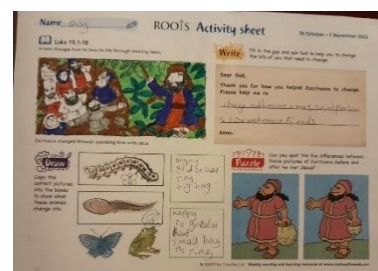
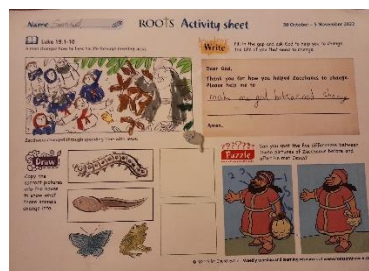
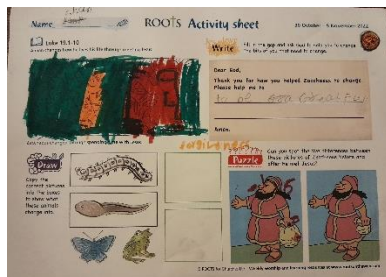
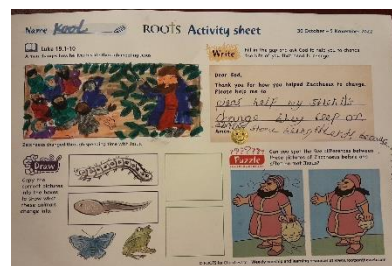
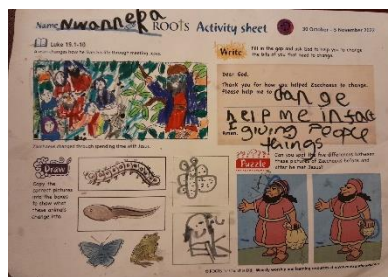

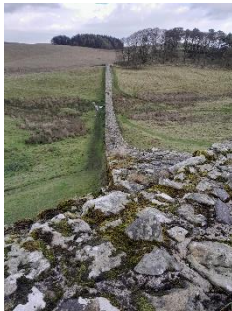
## Sunday School Pictures

Did you know there was a **“Fuel Bank”** run along the lines similar to that of a foodbank? Information is given below. It would be helpful to spread the word about this as already many people who are experiencing difficulty with their fuel bills have signed up.

Last week I went to **Shepherds Dene** my favourite retreat house in Northumbria. It is very close to Hadrian’s Wall and Roman Forts as well as a number of Castles and Mansions open to the public. Because I was with my niece, who has a car, we managed to get a lot of sight-seeing crammed in to 4 days. I honestly wish I could take all of you up there. The county is one of the most beautiful in England (yes, yes I know there are others!) and I actually managed to get onto Hadrian’s Wall and go round different excavations with the aid of a stick and my niece’s arm. The history of the Romans and the Northern Saints of England has always engrossed me and the story of the spread of Christianity is one to be read and discovered.

There has been so many protests that it is hoped by the time this newsletter reaches you, he has changed his mind and will attend. Jenny’s intercessions are ones we could perhaps pray daily in the hope that change will come to the Creation God made and “saw that it was good” and we can, in all countries, learn to work together and not just think of our own.

### Intercessions 30 October 2022 – pre- COP

This year’s climate change COP, the UN ‘Conference of the Parties’ of world leaders coming together to discuss and agree how to stop catastrophic climate change, begins in Egypt next weekend. It’s incredibly important that there are genuine and ambitious outcomes, and the negotiators need our prayers.

Before we pray for them, I’d like to suggest that we each pick up the leaf that you’ll have found on your chairs, and spend a moment in silence, thinking about it – its shape, its texture, its colours. Savour the detail in it, and the beauty, and uniqueness, think what it might be saying about the God who created it.....



it’s amazing that he took such trouble over such a small and apparently ordinary thing.....

Creator God, we bless you for the wonder and beauty of the natural world, for its diversity. We praise you for the colours, textures, shapes, sounds, smells, and tastes that help us flourish, and for what they can tell us about you



But, Lord, knowing that doesn't seem to have stopped us abusing and wasting what you have made, and ignoring the responsibility you've given us to care for your gorgeous, precious, and fragile creation. We acknowledge the devastation inflicted by global heating on the lives of the poorest people in the world, and that we're the ones who've caused it with our rich country lifestyles: they've done least to cause the problem but are worst affected by it. That's so unfair,

Lord -Thinking about that injustice, let's pray for them, and for ourselves:

*In this next section where I say, 'Creator God' please would you respond, 'in your mercy renew this damaged world' For the sake of those facing rising temperatures, drought and water shortage*

**Creator God, in your mercy renew this damaged world**

For the sake of those facing unpredictable weather, disrupted seasons and failed crops

**Creator God, in your mercy renew this damaged world**

For the sake of those facing flooding, land loss and salination of vital water supplies

**Creator God, in your mercy renew this damaged world**

For the sake of all those who fear the changing climate

**Creator God, in your mercy renew this damaged world**

For the sake of the poor, the vulnerable and the refugee

**Creator God, in your mercy renew this damaged world**

For the sake of us all, will you recreate our hearts that we might partner with you to renew this damaged world.

We pray for the world leaders and negotiators who will be gathering in Egypt next weekend for the UN climate talks. God of justice, this is such an important conference, and they've got to get it right. They know they *can* turn the crisis round. Please make them *want* to do that. Please will your Holy Spirit guide their discussions? Enable them to hear well the voices of those whose lives are already being devastated by the changing climate - who know what it's like to lose their homes, livelihoods, livestock, communities, traditional ways of life... hope. Give the negotiators compassion, a sense of urgency and the courage to commit to action that may not be popular but is the right thing to do. May your kingdom come at the COP as it is in heaven.

With all the turbulence we're going through in this country, let's pray also for our political leaders here. God of justice, love, and mercy, we lift the United Kingdom to you, with the economic and other crises causing such pain, hardship and fear among so many millions of people. Will you flood this country with your Spirit of unity, peace, and love? Will you bring hope to everyone who's wondering how to cope as winter approaches, for whom every day feels like an impossible challenge? Show each of us how we can respond to the needs of the people around us, rather than leaving it to someone else. And please, God, prompt our new government to act with grace, integrity, and justice, and not out of political expediency. Give them a heart for the poor, concern for the powerless, and compassion for the vulnerable. May your kingdom come in the UK, as it is in heaven.....

### **Message in a bottle - Jenny**

I've just discovered this scheme, run by the Lions Club nationally, which looks very useful:  
<https://lionsclubs.co/MemberArea/knowledge/lions-message-in-a-bottle/>.

The idea is that they supply a bottle and a form, on which you complete details of medication, allergies, next of kin and anything else that it's important to know in an emergency. The form goes in the bottle, which is then kept in your fridge (!) and a green sticker is placed on view from the front door, so the emergency services know they can quickly access crucial information if they need to.

The bottles are free and may be available from GPs and pharmacies, but can be ordered with only the postage to pay. Emergency services nationally are aware of the scheme.

I mention it because there are many of us at church who have some kind of caring responsibilities, and also because we may want to have our own bottle in the fridge, just in case. No-one has access to the information unless they look in the fridge, so it seems safe and secure. I received details from Mum's local authority in East Yorkshire and am confident they wouldn't be recommending anything that wasn't reliable.

### **Fuel Banks Foundation Information - Sally**

Fuel Banks were set up in 2015 as a collaboration between power and the Trussell Trust, the Fuel Bank Foundation is an independent charity. It makes sure people in difficulties have enough energy for cooking and heating. The Fuel Bank Foundation is run by a panel of trustees. It has also set up advisory panels made up of experts including those from Ofgem, Citizens Advice and Energy UK.

It is aimed at helping people with **prepayment meters** who are in fuel crisis – meaning those unable to pay for energy for cooking and heating. The charity also helps people who aren't connected to the mains gas network and have to bulk-buy fuel in advance for heating.

In its **2022 Fuel Crisis report**, the charity says that it has seen a **75% increase in demand** with **96%** of the people it supports having to choose between heating and eating – and this was before the latest energy price rises kicked in. Many many more people are feeling threatened and concerned because of this. *“After 6 years, we have a UK network of over 200 partners – many are located at the heart of their communities. We rely on them to identify people who are really struggling to cope. These are people who have fallen through every other safety net, so we provide them with some breathing space by giving approximately two weeks’ worth of fuel”.*
