

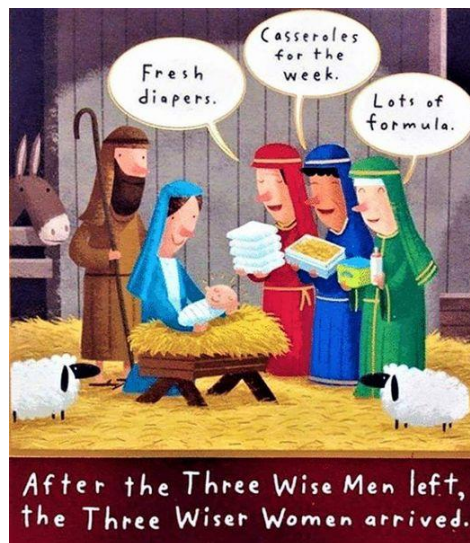
## Newsletter 11th January 2023



Dear Everyone

**Epiphany Greetings** to you all. Last Sunday was the, “The Feast of Epiphany”, which is celebrated 12 days after Christmas and celebrated by the Orthodox as their Christmas. This season celebrates the revealing of God in human form, with the visit of the Magi (or wise men) who brought gifts to the infant Jesus; each gift having its own significance; Gold – as a symbol of Kingship; Frankincense as a symbol of Deity and Myrrh, which is an embalming oil, as a symbol of Death. The word “Epiphany” comes from the Greek word “epiphaneia”, which means “appearing” and continues until 2<sup>nd</sup> February. The kings/wisemen/magi, are described in Matthew 2:1-11; “ *On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.* Included is a poem on Epiphany by Malcolm Guite.

Just a thought; I wonder what gifts we would have brought if we had had the opportunity.



**Science and Faith:** In this edition, Jenny writes about Kamran’s sermon on the Magi and the importance of the connection between science and faith. So many people see these two key areas as incompatible - but are they? There are many scientists who are Christians and much debate is taking place about this now to which they are joining in. One excellent podcast, which over 200 people joined in, took place last week from St Paul’s Cathedral, between Lay Canon Paula Gooder and the Roman Catholic, Brother Guy Consolmagno, an astronomer and the Director of the Vatican Observatory,. **Thinking of Night Shelters**, what shocked me last Sunday, when I went to our old Parish of St Peter's Belsize Park to attend the farewell service for their vicar, was seeing a number of small tents up against the wall in the church grounds containing people who were homeless. It really brought home to me the state we are in as a country regarding homelessness and the lack of affordable homes available to people, especially the young, that have so little chance of owning or often renting their own place to live. The average life expectancy of people sleeping on the streets is around 34 years old. As the Epistle of St James says, "So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead" (James 2:17) James takes it for granted that believing in Christ will move us to feel compassion for and act to help someone in need. Some urgent action has to be taken about this and our MPs made far more aware of this through letters and emails.












Sadly, **Anita's brother Chris Chaytor** passed away peacefully at home on Wednesday, the 4th of January, at the age of 59. He is survived by his wife, Sharmini, and two children in their 20s. He had been suffering from Multiple Sclerosis for many years. We pray for Chris, his wife, their two children as well as Anita, Simon and family.

#### **Faith and Science from Jenny**



**Jenny writes:** Those of you who were at church on Sunday or who joined the service online will have heard Kamran's super sermon on the story of the Magi in Matthew 2: 1-12. I was particularly struck by

the approach Kamran took to the debate that's been going on for centuries about whether science and faith are compatible. I'd not thought about that in the context of the Magi, and I found it really helpful to hear Kamran describe the Magi (translated 'wise men') as scientists - astronomers. For me that puts another slant on the debate - here are three scientists using their reason and intellects to follow a star but demonstrating great faith at the same time. 'I rest my case', as lawyers would say.

Coming home, I remembered that I'd seen publicity for one of the 'Conversations' held periodically by St Paul's Cathedral, which took place last Thursday. It features Brother Guy Consolmagno, an astronomer and the Director of the Vatican Observatory (I had no idea there was an observatory at the Vatican!!), and is entitled 'The heavens are telling the glory of God: Faith,, Science and Astronomy'. I've just watched it and it's so relevant to what Kamran was talking about, and so accessible, that I wanted to share it in case any other church members with access to Youtube would like to watch it as well. This is the link: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3V6lsUnuRRA>. It's 40 minutes long, and absolutely fascinating!

### **This is what the advance publicity said about it:**

'Br Guy Consolmagno says that science is an important way to get to know God. In this conversation with Paula Gooder about his role as director of the Vatican Observatory, they explore what meteorites tell us about God; why science and faith are more compatible than people imagine and the importance of story-telling to both science and religion. Thinking of the season of Epiphany, they also touch on the Magi and what star they might have seen at the time of Jesus' birth.'

Br Guy emphasises how God communicates through scientific enquiry, and suggests that he cheers when scientist makes a discovery, saying 'isn't that cool? Now let's find something else to discover'. Like so many believers Br Guy experiences God as he looks into the skies - the awesomeness of God the creator, and at the same time God's love for each individual. He also points out that scientists can't operate in isolation, and need a community to challenge and encourage them, share insights and celebrate big events. He goes on to say that it's exactly the same with religion - we need community for precisely the same reasons.

I could go on, but this would turn into a very long article!! Do watch the Conversation if you can, it's fascinating and contains some incredibly helpful insights and a lot of humour. I wouldn't have got round to watching it myself if Kamran hadn't preached the way he did on Sunday - so thank you Kamran!!

### **The First Sunday of Epiphany by Malcolm Guite**

The season of Epiphany is an invitation to reflect on the many little 'epiphanies', glimpses of how things really are, which are vouchsafed us in the Gospel. The first Sunday of Epiphany (January 8<sup>th</sup>) is a time to reflect on the moment when 'the heavens opened' at Jesus' Baptism and we were given a glimpse of Father, Son and Holy Spirit at the heart of all things. This sonnet is a reflection on that mystery.

It might have been just someone else's story,  
Some chosen people get a special king.  
We leave them to their own peculiar glory,

We don't belong, it doesn't mean a thing.  
But when these three arrive they bring us with them,  
Gentiles like us, their wisdom might be ours;
