Candlemas

Reflections for February from Canon Jessica Martin

Canon Jessica Martin is a Residentiary Canon at Ely Cathedral,

overseeing the Cathedral's learning work.

Her latest book is Holiness and Desire: What makes us who we are?



Yesterday we celebrated the feast of Candlemas, which is one name for the Feast held at the end of Christmas's forty days' season. Sometimes it's also called 'The Presentation of Christ in the Temple', recalling the day Jesus was brought by his parents to be dedicated to the service of God, recounted in the second chapter of <u>Luke's Gospel</u>.

In Ely Cathedral, Candlemas is celebrated as an evening eucharist. The dark nave flickers with clusters of small flames; around them the shadows seem particularly, smokily thick. The roof space all but vanishes; the altar, by contrast, with its tall, exactly spaced array of lights, blazes gold. All who come are given a candle: these are lit and then blessed from the font at the service's end. These are blessings to take away into the dark world's wraths and sorrows.

That strange mixture of shadow and bright flame, danger and hope, suffuses the story of Christ's presentation. Simeon, the old man awaiting the coming Messiah, will find the fulfilment of his vigil in the sight of the baby. With it he will also find his death. He is not afraid. The death forms part of the fulfilment: 'Lord', he prays, 'Let your servant depart in peace: my eyes have seen your salvation'. He has nothing left to long for: this is a life complete.

The prophecy Simeon speaks has as much pain in it as joy. The child is a sign 'that will be opposed', bringing conflict as well as peace. He is a light rising upon the turmoil of the nations. And he – the light of his mother's eyes – must wound her heart: 'a sword will pierce your own soul', the old man tells her. When the bright face of God blazes into the shadows, they look all the thicker for it. Light your candle of blessing, and take it, with your courage, in your hands.

Women's World Day of Prayer Hosted by Golders Green Parish Church – Sheila

This year Golders Green Parish Church is hosting the World Day of Prayer, called the Women's World Day of Prayer until a few years ago. An annual event, this is to be held in church on **Friday**, **3**rd **March starting at 2.00 p.m.** and lasting approximately an hour after which there will be light refreshments. The service is written by women telling their stories of life in the country represented. This year's country is Taiwan. Around the world this service takes place from 2.00 p.m. local time on the first Friday in March which means that it runs for 24 hours.

The service will be conducted by representatives from eight local churches using the service booklet provided. Although this is produced by a committee of women anyone is welcome to attend the service. There will be a collection during the service; gift aid envelopes are enclosed in the service booklets where there is a list of grants given previously on a back page.

We would welcome a couple of volunteers to provide the hospitality of hot drinks, the committee members will provide cakes and biscuits.

Space the Universe and Everything



The Son-et-Lumiere held at St Martin's for a week, was an invitation to come and explore the colour, movement and sound of our planet Earth in the context of the Universe. The intention of the event, was for those of us taking part to reflect on and marvel at our relationship with Earth and beyond; to think of the link between the divine and science, to do so by taking us on a journey through space to see galaxies emerge, and acknowledge humanity's ambition for adventure and exploration which is an essential part of ourselves.

The outside of St Martin's building was adorned with sound and light, picturing our exploration of space. It also drew us into being more aware of the splendid architecture of the church on to which it was reflected.





Inside the building the projections continued. We walked down into the crypt which was transformed by visions of the night sky with hundreds of stars reflected on the arches and ceiling accompanied with music especially composed for the event.



We then went up into the main body of the church into darkness and were suddenly immersed into a wide and stunning scenario of spectacular colours, shapes and sounds, one after the other, shooting out from the windows, from the walls and ceiling. These showed footage of the first rocket launch to explore the creation story and the Big Bang, on to viewing stars and planets and their reflected light, to the final image of Earth, as if looking back from space under a galaxy of stars. It was mesmerizing. It hit the senses in such a way that we became completely immersed into a full awareness of the beauty of sound, colour and movement in the Universe.







Certainly this event filled us with a sense of awe and wonder at the vastness and infinite variety of Space and how small we are. It couldn't but help remind us of the link between science and faith and humanity's desire to explore, to create, as well as to worship. The artist, Peter Walker, (with, "Luxmuralist", who designs these spectacular events for Cathedrals and Churches across the country) commented, "We are all responsible for this small planet that we started to explore in the 1960's. The artwork is about reflecting inwards as much as it is about reflecting outwards, and about how we take care of our small piece of the Universe." A thought for many of us to take away as we went home under the night sky.
