Fairtrade Fortnight: the next two weeks are "Fair Trade Fortnight" when we are reminded of the importance of buying produce from producers in countries where farmers are supported by getting a fair deal for their produce and better working conditions. In church our coffee, tea and sugar are all Fair Trade goods. If you cannot see them on the shelves of our supermarkets it is often a good idea to ask where they are – it does remind their staff produce is on the shelves! Nigeria: We continue to pray for Nigeria as the country currently goes through elections to choose new leaders. We pray for peace and tranquility and God's blessing and hope for unity and harmony in the country.

Ukraine-One year on: The war in Ukraine seems never ending. It is a threat to peace for the people of that country but also peace for the world. We continue prayers for those fighting; those who are made refugees by the bombing of their homes and have lost so many of their loved ones. We also pray for the people of Russia; that for them the war may end and they may experience freedom and peace from tyranny. We know there are many who are unwilling to fight are against the war and who have lost their sons from fighting and grieve for them. We remember Christ's words, "Blessed are the Peacemakers for they are the children of God".

Turkey and Syria: and of course we do not forget the terrible situation in Turkey and Syria where so many thousands have been killed by the earthquake and made homeless. Fairtrade Fortnight - Jenny

This year Fairtrade Fortnight runs from Monday 27th February to Sunday 12th March. It's a time when we're encouraged to think about the choices we make when we're shopping. The range of Fairtrade products is amazing and keeps on expanding. You can buy all kinds of food and drinks, fruit and vegetables, and clothes, flowers, beauty products - even gold if you're in that market!! Buying products with the Fairtrade mark means we can be sure the producers get a fair deal, and have decent working conditions. The way the world trade system works tends to discriminate against producers in low-income countries, so if we buy Fairtrade goods it makes a big difference to some of the poorest people on the planet.

At GGPC we committed a while ago to buying Fairtrade products whenever we can – in practice that's mostly tea, coffee and sugar, but we look out for other opportunities as well.

In our intercessions on Sunday I included this prayer, which appeared on the website of the Fairtrade Foundation and is inspired by Amos 8: 4-7. I'm setting out that passage as well. You probably recognise it. It challenges us to reflect on how the world does trade, and what God thinks about it. And, definitely speaking to myself, on how I can try not to be complicit in unjust practices.

Hear this, you who trample the needy
and do away with the poor of the land,
⁵ saying, "When will the New Moon be over
that we may sell grain,
and the Sabbath be ended
that we may market wheat?"—
skimping on the measure,
boosting the price
and cheating with dishonest scales,
⁶ buying the poor with silver
and the needy for a pair of sandals,
selling even the sweepings with the wheat.
⁷ The Lord has sworn by himself, the Pride of Jacob:
"I will never forget anything they have done.

This is the prayer: I love the idea of the God of the upside-down kingdom!

Tilt the scales, O God of the mustard seed:
that the poor shall see justice.
Share the feast, O God of Eden's abundant garden:
that each crop may fetch a fair price.
Upset the tables, O God of the upside-down kingdom:
that the least can benefit from their trade.
Open our eyes, O God of life in all its fullness:
that we may learn to walk the way of your son tilting, sharing, upsetting this world
Not satisfied until the products we bring to our table give a better deal to all who hunger for one.

One-year Anniversary of the Invasion of Ukraine – Jenny

24th February was the one-year anniversary of the invasion of Ukraine by Russia. Churches across Britain and Ireland were invited to join together in an act of solidarity to pray for Ukraine on Sunday 26th February, for an end to the conflict and for all those affected by the terrible impact of war. National services on the

24th were organised by Churches Together in Britain & Ireland and the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church. With colleagues from Christian Aid I attended the London service at The Cathedral of the Holy Family which was very moving. The congregation was a mixture of Ukrainians and representatives of UK churches, and songs were sung by children of St Mary's Ukrainian School. Images were shown of some of the thousands of Ukrainian military who have died since 24th February 2022, and 461 paper angels were suspended from the ceiling, representing the children killed in the conflict.

The following prayer was written by the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church especially for the anniversary, and was circulated to churches across the UK with the encouragement to use it in their services. I began our intercessions on Sunday by reading it: here it is:

Almighty and Great God, accept our gratitude for your boundless mercy towards us.

Hear the supplication of our afflicted hearts for the land and people of Ukraine, as they confront foreign aggression and invasion.

Open the eyes of those who have been overtaken by a spirit of deception and violence, that they be horrified by their works.

Grant victory over the powers of evil that have arisen and bless Ukraine with your gifts of liberty, peace, tranquility, and good fortune.

We implore you, O Merciful God, look with grace upon those who courageously defend their land.

Remember the mothers and fathers, the innocent children, widows and orphans, the disabled and helpless, those seeking shelter and refuge, who reach out to you and to their fellow human beings looking for mercy and compassion.

Bless the hearts of those who have already shown great generosity and solidarity, and those who prepare to receive their Ukrainian brothers and sisters in Ukraine's greatest time of need.

Bring us together as your children, your creation, and instill in us your strength, wisdom and understanding. May you be praised and glorified, now and forever, and to the ages of ages.
