Dear Everyone

Greetings to you all in this rather shivery weather. I hope you are managing to keep warm. Why not come and join us in a warm church with coffee and cake on Wednesday mornings, it takes our minds off the cold!

Please note that there are two events taking place very soon that are headlined in **Red** to draw your attention to them. One is on Sunday with our bishop, the other is the beginning of the Lent course on Thursday that will continue in each Thursday until the end of Lent.

Bishop Rob's Prayer Walk on 9 March: Bishop Rob has invited everyone to join him on a Prayer Walk on 9th March walking between particular places in the Barnet Deanery. It is expected that the Bishop will arrive at **Golders Green Bus Station by 2:30 pm**. We will go to the Clock Tower where we will pray for the Golders Green Parish (for people in our parish, the station, the business community and all the places of worship in Golders Green). **The Bishop will then come to the church and pray for us** after which he will walk to the Child's Hills Parish.

You are welcome to join the Bishop and other clergy in person or in your homes to pray for our parish and the Deaneries. Please do come.

Our Lent Course: starts on Thursday evening 9th March from 6.30pm. It will take place each Thursday throughout Lent in-person and by zoom. Details of the content are below. Please let Kamran know if you are likely to come straight from work as he will be providing refreshments.

Word Day of Prayer 2023: The World Day of Prayer that was held last Friday, hosted in our church, went very well indeed. It was attended by the Mayor of Barnet and a number of guests from different denominations. Pictures and a piece about it are below.

Lecture at St Paul's Cathedral: Professor John Barton, distinguished theologian and Church Historian, will be giving a lecture on his definitive book, "A History of the Bible: The Book and its Faiths". His book is the culmination of a lifetime's work. Professor Barton will explore the Bible's long evolution, how much good translations matter, and what contemporary scholarship reveals about the Bible, including how we understand its place at the heart of our faith.

Wednesday morning coffee: Finally, please come and join us for coffee, cake and chat in a warm church on from 10.30am -12.30pm. It will be so good to see you.


Please note that there will not be a Newsletter next week as I am away in Coventry for a few days.

Kamran is going to take one aspect in turn each Thursday with opportunities to discuss questions and issues that arise.



Word Day of Prayer 2023: I Have Heard about your Faith.



Every year the Christian women of a specific country have compiled a service for the World Day of Prayer. It is a worship event that takes place all over the world at different times on that day and in a large number of places. It is thought of as a huge wave of prayer going across the world and linking us all together and has been taking place since February 20, 1920 when the first Friday of Lent was established as a joint day of prayer for missions and was celebrated for the first time at that time.

This year the service was written by the women of Taiwan; a country that has had been the centre of superpower struggles and isolated internationally for decades. Only few countries have recognized it as a sovereign country. The service included letters of encouragement for the many women who face suffering and injustice and voices of Faith that resonate with women across the world. It was so good to come together with friends from different denominations, worship together and have tea afterwards being able to spend time talking and catching up. We welcomed the Mayor of Barnet, councilor Alison Moore, who spent a great deal of time with us talking with everyone. How good it was to see Anita after so long. It was a real pleasure and hope we see more of her when she and Simon are able to come. We miss them.

We thank the inter-denominational committee in our area for putting in a great deal of organization and work to make it such a good, prayerful service.





Coventry Litany of Reconciliation

The Coventry Litany of Reconciliation

The covetous desires of people and nations to possess what is not their own,

The greed which exploits the work of human hands and lays waste the earth,

Our indifference to the plight of the imprisoned, the homeless, the refugee,
God of Peace Forgive.

The lust which dishonours the bodies of men, women and children,
God of Peace Forgive.

The pride which leads us to trust in ourselves and not in God,
God of Peace Forgive.

Be kind to one another, tender hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.
