Stephen Lawrence Anniversary: Jenny has sent us a link about the 30th anniversary of Stephen Lawrence's murder in Eltham, south-east London, which took place on the 22 April 1993. A series of short videos have been made by Churches Together and Christian Aid, which are relevant to today and important to see. More information about it is given below.

Queen's Gallery Westminster Abbey: I have written a piece about the Queens Gallery at Westminster Abbey, to see all the many treasures they hold, and learn more about the history of the Church, the monarchy and the art of the carvings and tapestries created by highly skilled crafts people. It was well worth the visit.

The No Faith In Fossil Fuels Service: On this Saturday, 21st April 2023, "The No Faith In Fossil Fuels Service", will take place in the grounds of St Johns Church Waterloo. Many Bishops will be taking part in this alongside large numbers of Christians and those of other faiths. We will be gathering from 11am, for the service to start at noon. After the service, we will walk together towards Parliament, via Shell headquarters, to join The Big One protest

The Church Times in reporting it says, "In this critical time for life on our planet, it's vital that we unite to survive. So imagine this... Christians of different backgrounds and denominations coming together for a prayerful and prophetic service outside in the beautiful grounds of St Johns Church Waterloo. You are welcome to arrive from 11am, and people will be gathering while music plays. The service itself will start at noon and will involve prayerfully reflecting on why this is a critical time for life on our planet. We will hear from young people whose future is in the balance and those on the front lines of climate breakdown. We will also be joined by Engage Worship, who will be leading us in worship songs relating to God's creation. After the service we will walk together to Parliament in pilgrimage. People are invited to write prayers for climate justice on a placard, which you can hold up as we walk. On our way, we will pause outside the headquarters of Shell, before proceeding on to Parliament". I shall be going along with friends. If you are intertesd in joining in this gathering it will be lovely to see you.



Voter Identifications*: A recent government change has been made that requires from May 2023 all who are eligible to vote in Local and National elections must provide picture identification before they can cast their vote. If you do not have the correct identification you will not be abe to vote. It is especially important that you tell any young person eligible to vote about this as the requirements are that they should show evidence of their age. Many are not aware of this and we do not want them to be disenfranchised. It is important to know this well in advance of any local or National elections, so everyone is prepared and not caught out at polling stations. For further information, go to:

Stephen Lawrence Anniversary: Current State of Race Relations

This dreadful action that took place 30 years ago, remains a watershed moment for race equality in this country. To mark this significant event, Christian Aid and Churches Together in Britain and Ireland (CTBI) have brought together 14 leading Christian thinkers and theologians to discuss the legacy of Stephen Lawrence's racist killing*, and the current state of race relations in Church and society in Britain and Ireland. We have such a long way to go in this country to counteract racism in all its forms and would be helpful if, having looked at the videos, we could give some thought to how we can try to help make people more aware of the needless damage this causes to so many lives.

*Stephen Lawrence was a black British teenager from Plumstead, southeast London, who was murdered in a racially motivated attack while waiting for a bus in Well Hall Road, Eltham on the evening of 22 April 1993, when he was 18 years old.

Queen's Gallery Westminster Abbey:

A couple of weeks ago I wrote about visiting Westminster Abbey to see the window created by David Hockney in honour of the late Queen Elizabeth's Silver Jubilee. While there, I visited the Queen's Gallery which is now placed at the very top of the Abbey in the rafters.

The Gallery is set more than 16 metres (52 feet) above the Abbey's floor in the medieval triforium (*a gallery or arcade above the arches of the nave, choir, and transepts of a church*). It was amazing, not just to see all the treasures and effigies of past Kings and Queens so well displayed, but quite something to look down from that height onto the nave of the Abbey and watch people looking like ants walking around. Certainly a "birds-eye view" but not for anyone who suffers from fear of heights.





The Abbey's collection contains their thousand-year history of great treasures. These include the oldest surviving alter piece (1259) in England from Henry III; many funeral and life-like effigies from the 14th to 17 centuries, of Kings and Queens modelled on their death masks, often displayed in their sumptuous clothes. Much of the gold paraphernalia used by Kings and Queens at their coronations is there but this time it had all been taken away to be cleaned and repaired for the coronation of King Charles III, including the coronation chair. The spaciousness of the gallery and its layout made it possible to see all the treasures with ease and have time to view closely all the aspect you were most interested in. As in all galleries and museums, there was too much to take in in one visit. I certainly intent to go back and enjoy more of the artifacts that I gave only a cursory glance to.

International travel

Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country

Driving and Parking

- Driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state (this includes a provisional driving licence)
- A Blue Badge

Local travel

Older Person's Bus Pass funded by the Government of the United Kingdom



- Disabled Person's Bus Pass funded by the Government of the United Kingdom
- Oyster 60+ Card funded by the Government of the United Kingdom
- Freedom Pass
- Scottish National Entitlement Card
- 60 and Over Welsh Concessionary Travel Card
- Disabled Person's Welsh Concessionary Travel Card
- Senior SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
