Epiphany week 1: This is the first week of the Season of Epiphany when Jesus was baptized by John; the Holy Spirit descended upon him in the form of a Dove, and a voice came from `heaven saying, “You are my Son, the Beloved, with you I am well pleased” (Luke 3:15-17. 21-22) As Malcolm Guite says when he writes about Epiphany, “The season of Epiphany is an invitation to reflect on the many little ‘epiphanies’, glimpses of how things really are, which are vouchsafed us in the Gospel. Today, the first Sunday of Epiphany is a time to reflect on the moment when the heavens opened and we were given a glimpse of Father, Son and Holy Spirit at the heart of all things.” Malcolm’s poem is below.

Perhaps this is a time for each of us to reflect on our “Little Epiphanies”, what they mean and how they have changed us.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity:



The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is an ecumenical Christian observance that is celebrated internationally. It is kept annually between Ascension Day and Pentecost, between 18 January and 25 January. The importance of praying and working for Unity among all Christians cannot be overemphasized

at this time of unrest and uncertainty, in the Church at home, here in the United Kingdom, and with those across the world of whatever denomination. Christians are called to live in Peace, Love and Harmony with each other in a world of complete upheaval, injustice and unrest. To quote the description given, “There are seven elements that unite us; one body [of believers], one Spirit, one hope, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of us all. Each of these common areas is greater than any potential differences we may have”. We could be a role model of Faith to the world and, as St James says in his letter to new Christians, we can do so with “Prayer and Good works” to try and make it happen.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity Prayers from Jenny

"This year's *week of prayer for Christian Unity* begins on Saturday. I'm anticipating that in our prayers this morning by adapting words written for this week of prayer by the Bose monastic community in Italy.

I'll begin with an introduction and follow that with a time of silence: I'll follow that with one of their reflections and again, we'll have a few moments after that to reflect silently on anything that may have stood out for you".

Introduction:

The Spirit of God from the beginning has breathed life. We are called to live with humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

We cannot live out this call in our own strength, rather we must receive the gift of God's Spirit within us, like the disciples gathered in the upper room. Jesus, appearing to the disciples, said: 'Peace be with you' and showing them his hands and his side, breathed on them

When we live apart from the Spirit we lose our breath and return to dust, but when we look to Jesus for life and breath, we are recreated for the work of renewal and for the co-creation of the dream of God to be made real here and now. That is our common calling as we are sent into the world in the power of the Spirit.

Reflection

Swirl of dust moving along the face of the ground,
untameable presence hovering above the water,
flicker of flame and wisp of smoke.

There,
there you are.

Breathing, dancing, tending, challenging, bristling with energy.

By your breath,
your dreams for the world are made into flesh and bone,
animated by your love,
we can be fire dancers, peace breathers and bone shakers.

Lord of life, we receive all creation from your hand and by your providence. Teach us to live in your world with care and seeking justice for all that you have created. This week we are conscious of the extreme weather across the UK, and even more the devastation and tragedies caused by the wild fires in California. We lift to you everyone who is affected, asking for your comfort, protection and restoration. We know that the changing climate has made these events worse than they would have been. We think also of the millions of people in the poorest parts of the world whose lives are also being devastated by the changing climate but who don't get the media coverage. Creator God we need you to keep on reminding us that we all have a part to play in turning this crisis around. Please will you show us what that is, and motivate us to do it?.....

Loving God, grant us the gift of hope in abundance in a world troubled by division and violence. Strengthen your people afflicted by apathy and fear.

God there's so much conflict, land-grabbing, greed, so many people everywhere are being persecuted, exploited and marginalised. This week

we particularly pray for the victims and survivors of the grooming and rape gangs in this country, and of all forms of gender-based violence and abuse wherever they are in the world. . May they experience healing, hope, peace and justice. Will you guide our politicians towards responses that are right and good and give them the courage to pursue those?.....

Merciful God, forgive us for the times we have failed to live a common life as Christians. Draw us more deeply to one faith in you so that we may witness to the world. God, we're so conscious of divisions between and within denominations, It's easy to be so distracted and agitated by our differences and disagreements that we don't see what unites us. Will you show all of us what's really important in your great plan and help us to focus and work together on that?

Holy Spirit, Heavenly Comforter, we pray that we may trust more in the gifts of your truth, wisdom and love than in the cleverness of our thinking. There's been so much in the news this week about the digital world including Artificial Intelligence and social media. Will you help us to discern and celebrate what is good in it, and to notice and reject what is destructive and abusive?.....

Compassionate Lord, lead us to work together so that wherever there is darkness and oppression, suffering and injustice, we may bring your light and freedom.....

Almighty God,

accept our praise and thanksgiving

for what already unites us.

Hasten the hour when we will recognise each other

in the one communion you willed

and for which your Son prayed.

Blessed be God, now and forever. Amen

For two thousand years, the Virgin Mary has been depicted throughout art, literature and culture as symbolising the perfect mother: chaste, beautiful, meek, mild and white. These supposed virtues and symbols have penetrated not just Christianity but wider popular culture; and contributed to harmful views about motherhood and what it is to be a woman

Chine McDonald will deconstruct the myth of perfect motherhood and reflect on its theological, social and personal impact, proposing a more authentic, grace-filled way forward.

Chine McDonald is the Director of Theos, the religion and society think tank. Previously she headed community fundraising and public engagement at Christian Aid. The author of the best-selling *God is Not a White Man (and other revelations)*, her latest book is *Unmaking Mary: Shattering the Myth of Perfect Motherhood*.
